- Total waterworks revenues (R) - \$241,461.00
- Total waterworks expenditures (E) - \$147,419.00
- Total debt payments on waterworks infrastructure loans (D) - \$199,000.00

For 2021, waterworks revenues covered .73% of the waterworks expenditures and debt payments.

Have you ever wondered what you may need in an emergency situation? No power? No water? Blizzard? Shelter in place? Here are a few tips taken from the Emergency Preparedness guide provided by Public Safety Canada.

“In an emergency, you will need some basic supplies. Be prepared to be self-sufficient for at least 72 hours. You may have some of the items already, such as food, water and a battery operated or crank flashlight. The key is to make sure they are organized and easy to find. Would you be able to find your flashlight in the dark? Make sure your kit is easy to carry and everyone in the household knows where it is. Keep it in a backpack, duffle bag or suitcase with wheels, in an easy-to-reach, accessible place, such as your front-hall closet. If you have many people in your household, your emergency kit could get heavy. It’s a good idea to separate some of these supplies in backpacks. That way, your kit will be more portable and each person can personalize his or her own grab-and-go emergency kit.”

- Water – at least two litres of water per person per day; include small bottles that can be carried easily in case of an evacuation order
- Food that won’t spoil, such as canned food, energy bars and dried foods (replace food and water once a year)
- Manual can-opener
- Crank or battery-powered flashlight (and extra batteries). Replace batteries once a year
- First aid kit
- Extra keys to your car and house
- Some cash in smaller bills
- A copy of your emergency plan and emergency contact information

Bylaw Brief Animal Control Bylaw 439/17

Owning an animal is a huge responsibility, owners should be aware of their municipality’s bylaw. Here are a few notable points from our Animal Bylaw. You can view the bylaw in full on our website or in the town office.

- No owner of any dog or cat shall be in care and control of a dog or cat unless such dog or cat has been licensed for the current license year.
- All dogs, when off the premises of its owner, must not be running at large.
- If a dog or cat defecates on any property other than the owners, the owner shall remove such feces immediately.
- It shall be unlawful to keep live poultry, livestock, pigeons and/or bees, within the boundaries of the Town of Stoughton, except on the premises of the Stoughton Fairgrounds in connection with shows, fairs, and/or exhibitions held with the permission of the Stoughton Parks & Recreation Board.
