Year at a Glance: 2025 Highlights

We're proud to share the progress and accomplishments made throughout the year. From completed infrastructure projects to strong community investments, here's a snapshot of what we achieved together:

Grants and Funding Successes

- **ICIP Waterline Project:** The project is now complete, marking a major milestone in strengthening our water infrastructure.
- **Summer Day Camp:** With \$5,000 in funding from the *SPRA Framework in Action* grant, the camp was a huge success with 30 attendees. We plan to continue this camp in 2026.
- **Training Grant:** Secured \$2,000 for staff education, supporting our golf course groundskeeper in completing Turf Management training through Olds College.
- **Canada Summer Jobs Grant:** Supported summer employment at both the Pool and Golf Course.
- **Stoughton Credit Union Sponsorship:** A generous \$75,000 contribution toward the Clubhouse Renovation. Renovations are on track to be completed before the season begins in April 2026.
- **Cemetery Enhancement:** A \$25,000 donation from Gordon Coutts funded the completion of a new Stone Garden Wall at the cemetery. The project is now complete.

Roads and Infrastructure

- **Main Street Preparations:** Work was completed at the end of Main Street in preparation for paving planned this summer that will support upcoming Main Street beautification efforts.
- **Sidewalk Repairs:** Sidewalk upgrades on Main Street and Railway Avenue are now complete, with additional repairs planned to continue.

Recreation Updates

- **Curling Club:** Initial work has been completed, allowing the Ice Plant upgrade to begin at the end of the curling season.
- **Fairgrounds Playground:** Received \$100,000 from the RM of Tecumseh toward the development of a new playground at the Fairgrounds that is planned to be installed June 2026.

These accomplishments reflect the continued collaboration between Council, staff, and our community. Thank you for your ongoing support as we work together to make Stoughton an even better place to live.
